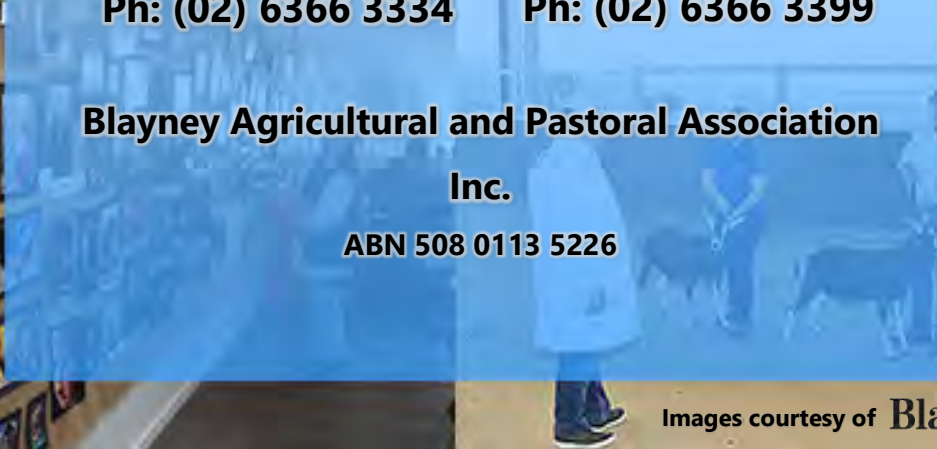

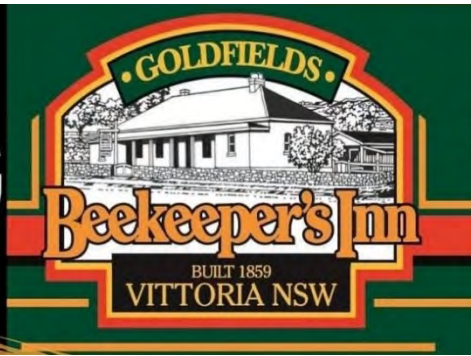

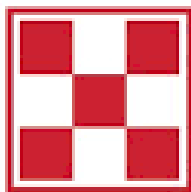

In addition, each member becomes the instrument of assisting the Association, created for the encouragement & development of Agriculture, Horticulture, Farm & Pastoral Pursuits, Improvement of Livestock, Implements & Machinery for Agricultural purposes.

GROUND RENT & SIDESHOW REGULATIONS

SIDESHOW REGULATIONS

All sideshows operating must have proper risk insurance cover.

COSTS:

- **GROUND RENT:** \$3.00 per metre, plus \$20.00 electricity pending current charges. Minimum charge \$20.00 to be paid to the Chief Ground Steward or the Committee's Deputy on demand.
- **TRADE EXHIBITS** such as machinery, motor cars etc. \$5.00 per metre.
- **COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS** \$5.00 per metre.

The Association reserves the right to refuse any space allocation as they think fit.

Applications for space to be in the hands of the Secretary seven (7) days prior to the Show.

The Chief Ground Steward has full control; of all ground space & camping areas & is empowered by the committee to use her own discretion on all matter.

MAIN PAVILION EXHIBITS

The Committee will accept no responsibility for accident to exhibit, competitor or spectator during our Show. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of exhibitors at time of entry, unless otherwise expressed in the schedule. The name, residence & district of exhibitor must be given when entering exhibits. Exhibitors shall if required furnish a statutory declaration as to the bona-fides of their exhibits. All exhibits must be properly placed & ticketed on the day & hour specified in the schedule & time sheets; at which hour the judges will commence inspection.

Exhibits entered in the wrong class may be placed in the correct class by the Stewards, if authorised by the Judge. *No exhibit shall be removed before 4.30pm* unless with the permission of the Stewards of the section. The Association will not be responsible for any accident caused through or by any exhibit and will not under any circumstances be responsible for any loss, injury to, or mis delivery of any exhibit of any kind or for any damage done thereto. Exhibitors shall accept the decision of the Judge or Judges appointed by the Committee of the Association. Any exhibitor or other person interfering with the Judge or calling into question his or their awards on the ground or be guilty of unseemly conduct to any Judge or Steward or Official of the Association may be expelled from the ground, and if an exhibitor, his exhibits be disqualified.

Judges, upon arrival at the showground, shall report to the Secretary's Office for direction. Only authorised persons will be allowed in the vicinity of the Judges whilst judging. The Judges shall have power to disqualify & mark as disqualified any exhibit which in their opinion does not comply with the regulations and class and shall enter the reason in their books. After judging, Stewards are to obtain Awards Book and please return same to the Secretary's Office. All protests fully setting out the grounds of such protest in writing must be lodged with the Secretary before 6.00pm on the Show Day, accompanied by a fee of \$10 which shall be forfeited to the Association if the Committee deems the protest frivolous. In all protests the decision of the Committee shall be final & without appeal.

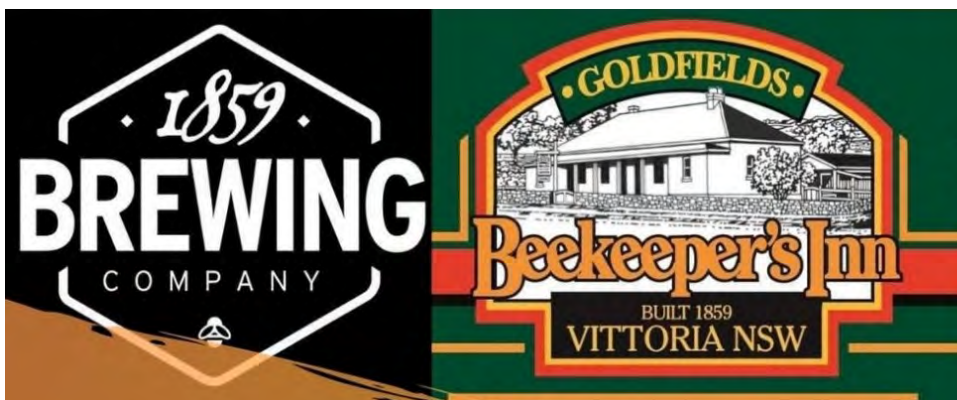

INSTRUCTIONS TO STEWARDS

The Society will take all reasonable care of exhibits received for exhibition but accepts no responsibility in connection with any exhibit, & every exhibitor who delivers any article, bird or animal to the Society representatives for exhibition, does so in accordance with these rules.

STEWARDS IN ALL SECTIONS SHALL:

- Attend at the time & place notified
- Wait upon the Judges, afford them all the information & attention necessary to the discharge of their duties, but must not say anything to influence their decision.
- See that all classes in the respective sections are judged.
- Countersign the Judge's awards, obtain prize cards from Secretary & affix to the exhibits.
- Remove all exhibitors & other persons from the vicinity of judges while judging.
- Not to reveal the name of any exhibitor or repeat the Judge's remarks.
- Arrange among themselves for constant supervision of their Sections.
- In case it is advisable to reject any exhibit or in doubt on a matter, report same to Secretary.
- Pavilion Stewards are requested to attend close of Show to deliver exhibits to exhibitors or their authorised receivers.
- It is strongly recommended to arrive early & acquaint themselves with their duties.

(Electronic waivers to be filled out online with Property Identification Codes (PIC). PIC No. can be obtained from the Local Land Service website.

Nominate will issue an entry number issued which must be printed out by the entrant and used on the day as proof of class entries and for results.

NO ENTRIES WILL BE TAKEN ON THE DAY - EXCEPT FOR THE SHOWJUMPING SECTION **- Entries will be taken as usual at the Show jumping Area.**

Anyone without a number issued by nominate will have to fill in a Waiver and receive a Wristband.

Rules and Regulations

Must wear a collar and be securely tied to a truck or trailer and supervised at all times. Such vehicle must display an official magnet giving notice that a stallion is on board. Stallions are NOT permitted to compete in Hack, Riding or Turnout Classes specific stallion Breed Classes may be exempt. Stallions may be substituted in prize-giving ceremonies with another horse should the rider deem it to be safer.

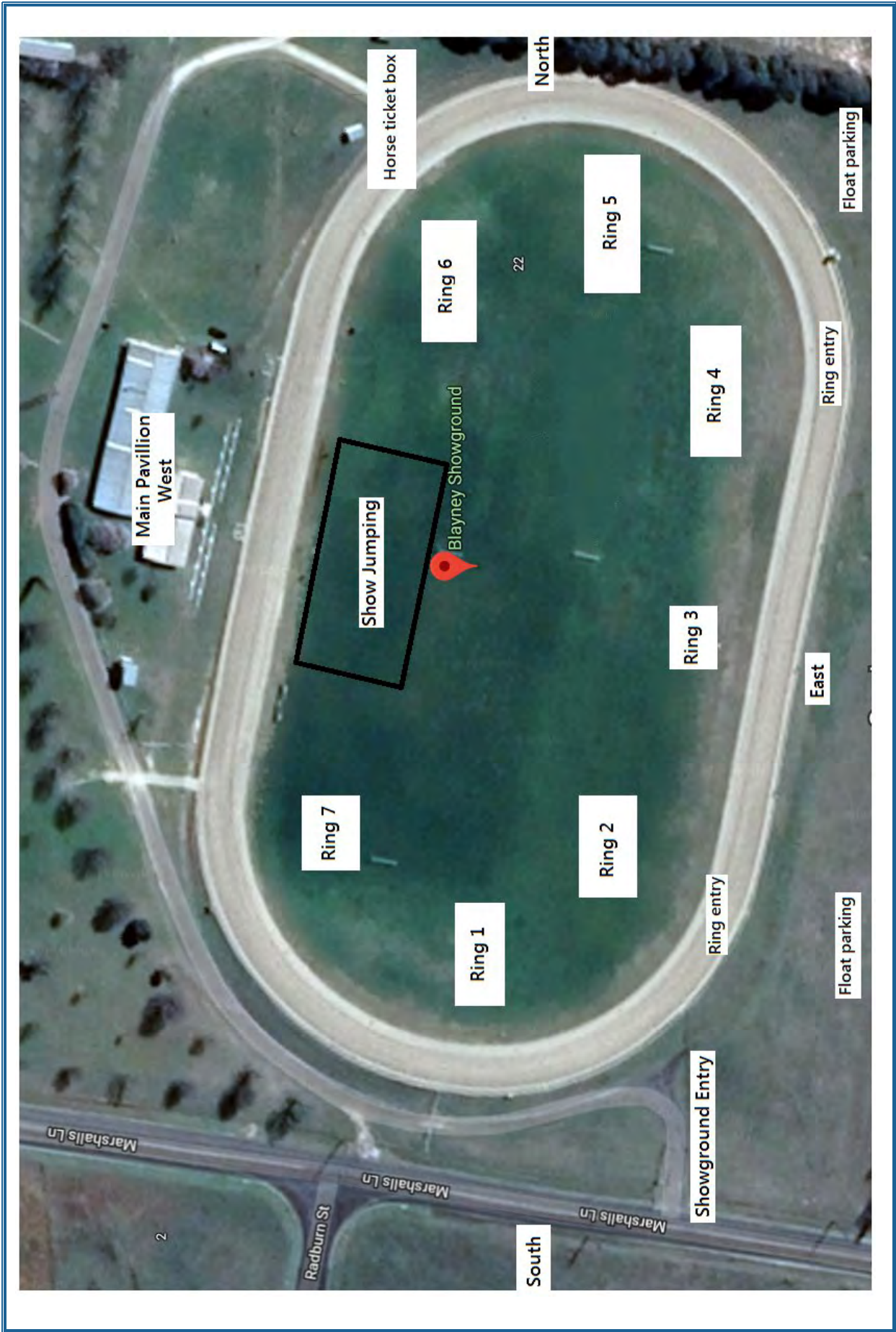
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HORSE EVENTS - MAP

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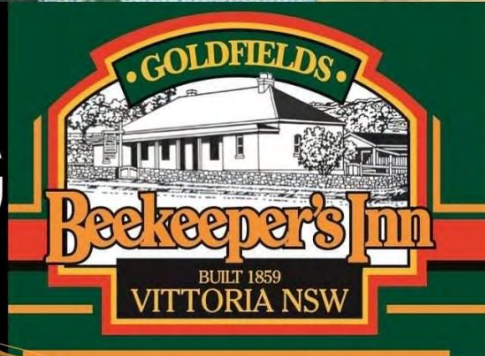
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Class 28. Man cake recipe: BLUEBERRY & POLENTA CAKE (Serves 10)

INGREDIENTS:

- 3 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups of sugar
- 250 mls (8 1/2 fl oz) of olive oil
- 50g (2 oz) of unsalted butter, melted 250g (9 oz) of Greek style plain yoghurt 1 cup of polenta
- zest & juice of 1 lime
- 1 1/2 cups of self-raising flour 1 teaspoon of baking powder 250g (9 oz) of blueberries

METHOD:

- Preheat the oven to 160 C (320 F/ Gas 2-3), Grease & flour a 27cm (11 inch) springform tin.
- Beat the eggs & sugar until pale, then beat in the olive oil & melted butter. Add the yoghurt, polenta, lime zest & juice & mix well. Fold in the flour & baking powder. Pour half the batter into the cake tin. Sprinkle the blueberries over the batter, then pour in the remaining batter.
- Bake for 40 minutes or until a skewer, inserted into cake comes out clean. Leave in tin to cool. Serve cake at room temperature

Class 29. Rich fruit cake competition recipe

First Prize: \$20, 2nd Prize: \$10 - The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants

INGREDIENTS:

- 250g (8 oz) Sultanas
- 250g (8 oz) chopped raisins 250g (8 oz) currants
- 125g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
- 90g (3 oz) chopped red glace cherries 90g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g (8 oz) plain flour
- 60g (2 oz) self-raising flour 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves 250g (8oz) butter
- 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs

METHOD:

- Mix together all the fruits & nuts & sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.
- Cover & leave for at least one hour, preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flour & spices. Cream together butter & sugar with the essences.
- Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit & flour mixtures.
- Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") & bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 to 4 hours.
- Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
- Note: To ensure uniformity & depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries 4-6 pieces & almonds, crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

The High Jump is open to all dogs and is a great way to support your local show while having fun and a chance to win some great prizes.

- All dogs will take turns at jumping in each round.
- At the end of each round the height will be increased.
- All dogs that made the previous height will then jump again.
- Each dog is allowed 3 attempts at each height and shall be disqualified if unsuccessful on the third attempt.
- In the event of 2 dogs jumping the same height, the winner will be the dog that took the least attempts of the winning jump.
- Judges decision is final.
- The handler can encourage the dog over by vocal or visual command but not by pushing or pulling the dog over.

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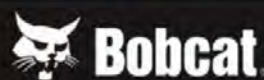
